"If you can?" said Jesus. "Everything is possible for one who believes." (Mark 9:23)

To say this year has been filled with uncertainty is a significant understatement. But as I write this, I am reminded that anything is possible through faith in our Lord.

One Sunday morning in early December, I stood before the congregation and shared the very real news that Bluffton UMC was on pace for a sizable budget shortfall for the first time in more than 15 years. The Finance Committee understood that the actions of the 2024 General Conference would have an impact on our congregation (and giving) as we gathered to build the BUMC Budget for 2025. We were conservative in our planning, but we also saw the need to continue all the good work this church had accomplished in 2024!

Following that Sunday morning "call to action" however, we began to receive responses. This included a donation from a church member who offered to match any worship offerings in the remaining weeks of December (dollar for dollar) up to \$50,000.00. The responses kept coming and coming!

I am pleased to report that as of the end of the year, we have once again exceeded our annual budget for Worship Offerings and there is no budget shortfall for 2024. **God is Good.**

Our December Worship Offerings totaled a record \$177,196.00. As a result, our 2024 Worship Offerings totaled \$667,335 and exceeded our budget by more than \$40,000. We received an additional \$117,352.00 in designated funds giving, including \$68,318 in permanent endowment donations. We also received \$109,179 in Roof and HVAC repair donations in 2024. **God is Good.**

I have learned over the years that being part of a church finance committee is a difficult balancing act. It requires you to act responsibly, to utilize restraint, to focus on practical matters, and to be fiscally conservative. However, it also requires you to never lose sight of the fact that a church is not a business, and it cannot be run like one. In 2025, the BUMC Finance Committee will continue to be conservative in the management of the Church's resources, but we will not forget that through faith, all things are possible.

ANNEX UPDATE

Members of the BUMC congregation,

As we start the new year, I want to update you on the plans for the Annex, but first thank those who have worked hard to adjust so that missions can continue. All of the members who were operating in the annex have been very gracious in continuing their missions and service to others in alternative ways. There has been discussion about what will be happening with the annex as we look forward to the future after the fire.

The question that seems to be most commonly asked is what is the status and future of the annex? There is an insurance settlement that has been paid and is being held in anticipation of returning the annex to the use of the church. The full settlement will be paid to us when we make repairs or rebuild with any changes. James Atkins of Court and Atkins Architects and a member of our congregation, has met with representatives of the various groups who used the annex to gather needs and dreams. He is creating plans and options reflecting the needs and wishes and their estimated cost. Any enhancements that involve more than returning it to its original state will require additional resources. We will also likely need to address code issues in any repair or renovation.

Is this an opportunity to enhance this property to more effectively serve our mission? With that question in mind, the Administrative Council has established a committee to help frame the options ultimately to understand what are the pros and cons. This committee will consider what might be the plan going forward, but will not decide that for the church. The committee will be made up of the Chair of Administrative Council, James Atkins, representatives from Finance, Trustees and a member of the program staff. This committee will consider the question of should we stay within the limits of the insurance settlement or should we consider what enhancements would be helpful? Is there interest in a building campaign to raise the money to enhance the annex?

After considering these questions and the suggestions of what might be done with the facility, the Committee will report their findings and deliberations to the Administrative Council. Information will be shared at appropriate times with the congregation. Based upon recommendations and the level of support and different recommendations received, Administrative Council will make a decision and the project can then move forward.



The BUMMs have been quite active during the final months of 2024. This year's Christmas parade saw some of the coldest weather of the year. The "shivering" BUMMs hosted a donut, soft drink and coffee table at the parade, offering appreciated refreshments to the crowd attending the activities and accepting donations as donuts and drinks were distributed. All donations that were received will go into the BUMMs funds that are distributed to the charities that we support.

Every year, the BUMMs largest fundraising activity is our Pecan Sale that occurs primarily during October and November. Each year, we learn ways that might improve our sale efforts. The BUMMs have expanded our payment options now to include payment by credit card. We also participate in the weekly Bluffton Farmers Market which has expanded our market reach for pecan sales. As the year-end approaches, our gross sales total is over \$26,000.00 and our profit from sales has hit \$8,000.00. We just sold all of the bags this past Sunday, so our profit may increase slightly.

We appreciate all of the support that we receive from our Church family, as well as the community at large. The money that we raise is donated to a list of local charities that we support each year. The BUMMs also have a Scholarship fund with which we offer a cash scholarship offering to deserving students for furthering their education. We believe that education is an essential element of the growth and development of our young people. We are presently reviewing how our Scholarship fund operates with the goal being to make improvements that may offer greater benefit to our young people as they work to continue their education experience.

This year has been a good year for donations to the deserving charities and we look forward to making the next year even stronger with your help and support of the BUMMs and our activities.

The BUMMs meet on the first Saturday of each month, starting with a full breakfast prepared by our "BUMM Chefs" and served in the Church fellowship hall. Breakfast starts at 9 AM and is followed by a business meeting. We often have a guest speaker from one of our charities or some other community leader to present a program. We encourage all men of the Church family to come visit a BUMM meeting. You'll certainly find it a great breakfast and will likely meet some new friends. Our activities each year are focused on providing support to our deserving charities, as well as providing opportunities for fellowship and growth for the men of the BUMMs. Give us a try—we think you'll enjoy it!
