For today, I am showing you the red tractor, because it says a lot about my agricultural roots that I took such a picture. Every trip I take, I find myself looking at the fields, orchards, and vineyards. What do they grow here? How do they cultivate their crops? Do they irrigate and if so, how? Will there be a good harvest this year?



In Greece, we saw rows and rows of olive trees. Our guide said there are approximately 65 million olive trees in Greece. There were fig trees and the grape vineyards were beginning to put out leaves. There are signs of a harvest to come.

I wonder if these are questions for our church as well. What are we growing? What efforts are we, as a church and as individuals making to grow and cultivate disciples?



OUR CHURCH HISTORY



"Since God acts in human history, historical records are of great significance. They become salvation history because they contain the story of God's action to save sinful human beings."

What former pastor rose to the rank of Major in the U.S. Army?

Feltham Samuel James was an active member of Epworth League (the forerunner of the Methodist Youth Fellowship) in his hometown of Sumter. As an only child, he found community in that group of fellow believers and learned valuable leadership skills. He graduated from Sumter HS in 1924, received an A.B. from Wofford in 1928 and an M.A. in 1932 from Duke University. His thesis was entitled *"The Attitude of the Church Toward the Use of Dramatics in Religious Education."* Perhaps he enjoyed performing in church plays during those early years.

Following a couple of temporary assignments, Pastor James accepted a one-year assignment to Bluffton in 1933, where he was ordained as a deacon. He was unmarried and age 28. What kind of sermons did he preach? Did he add a touch of drama to his messages?

At that time, Bluffton still had oyster-shelled streets. It must have been a different world for him, the sights, the smells, and low-country living. Was he a fan of the local shellfish or did he long for the comfort food of his childhood?

There were about 40 white families living in Bluffton town at that point, with 20 or so high school students, and about 30 elementary students. *Did he focus on the young people, teaching the Gospel and building a strong faith based in action? Was the Epworth League a part of his ministry?

Less than 10 years after leaving Bluffton, at the start of World War II, Rev. James became a Chaplain in the US Army, serving at Walter Reed Hospital. In 1943, he wrote the Chaplain's Manual for the US Army. As a Methodist minister in Washington D.C., he preached at the first church service Harry Truman attended after taking office. What message did he offer to the President in those fateful days? Growing in faith, from the young man in Bluffton's pulpit, Rev. James became the National Chaplain of the American Legion. He went on to gain Freedom Foundation awards, to publish inspiring sermons and addresses, and to lead congregations and organizations within the Methodist Church with a strong sense of faith in action. He was awarded an Honorary Doctor of Divinity degree by Wofford University in 1960. Dr. James published a book of sermons and messages entitled "For God & Country" in 1977. These are his words:

"One of our greatest faults is that we too seldom pause to recall the heroic service of those brave men and women of yesterday... Out of our past we should learn the lessons for building the future... All our efforts will fail ... unless at the foundation we put the basic stone of the fatherhood of God and the brotherhood of man... We must take up the torch, hold it high and march under the banner of the kingdom of God." The Rev. Dr. Feltham Samuel James died January 19, 1984, at the age of 79, in Greenville, SC. He is buried in the Aiken Memorial Garden in Aiken, SC. His legacy of faith-filled service continues to be an inspiration to current and future generations.
